Editorial

The Town Hall of Vila Franca de Xira presents another edition of *Cartoon Xira*, an exhibition celebrating Culture and Freedom of Expression. The cartoon, or humorous drawing is a living expression of that very same freedom of expression and this exhibition remains timely, since recent events, continue to place cartoonists and their cartoons at the centre of considerable controversy, political pressures and sometimes even manifestations of intolerance, which seem not to take into account some principles that we consider essential in a democratic society.

We are therefore proud to present in this *Cartoon Xira* the work of two cartoonists from Vila Franca de Xira: António Antunes - who has collaborated with the Town Hall since the first edition and curates this Exhibition - and Vasco Gargalo. They are joined by André Carrilho, Cristina Sampaio, António Maia, Henrique Monteiro, Rodrigo Matos, Cristiano Salgado and, for the first time, Nuno Saraiva who we warmly welcome and who, through their work, give continuity to the prestige of this Exhibition.

Our international participation will be in the hands of Cau Gomez, a widely acclaimed Brazilian cartoonist, who also contributes, with his works and a 32-year-long career, to the affirmation of artistic, creative and thought freedom values.

In fact, Culture and Art continue to play an essential role for the health and dynamism of our society. Through them, in their multiple forms of expression, we often find privileged means for the awakening of consciences in relation to current events and which have a strong influence on our daily lives.

By holding *Cartoon Xira,* the Town Hall of Vila Franca de Xira continues enthusiastically to value cartoon as an artistic manifestation and to promote a cultural event whose quality is recognized nationally and internationally. In this way, we also contribute to the preservation of Freedom of Expression and Democracy, which we greatly value.

Do you want me to draw you a picture?

The question we ask, almost always in a sarcastic tone, when our interlocutor has difficulty in understanding something, seems to hold two, let's say, problematic assumptions: first, that a drawing is easy to make; second, that a drawing is easy to interpret. The question is right at least on one point. A drawing is fast and effective, i.e. unlike a text (especially a long text) a drawing has an instant impact.

When the drawing is a cartoon, all these features are enhanced. It is harder to do, harder to interpret, and the shock it causes is more intense.

The great Colombian cartoonist Ricardo Rendón proposed a famous definition: a joke is a honeycoated dart. Like the best definitions of humour, it highlights its ambiguous character. On the one hand, it is a dart, and on the other hand, it is coated with honey. It is, to use another famous expression, a benign transgression. At some points in history, however, there seems to be a certain inclination towards literality, which tends to simplify what is complicated, and part of the definition is obliterated or forgotten.

This is most likely one of those moments when there is a clear tendency to understand comedy as an aggression. It's just a dart. A transgression – nothing else. And a serious one. Jorge of Burgos, the blind librarian of *The Name of the Rose* would agree. According to this understanding, laughter is ethically suspicious. To attack another, whoever they may be, is immoral - and to attack them in such a way as to cause laughter is, moreover, despicable. It is, quite simply, about getting pleasure from an aggression.

It is therefore obvious that cartoonists are particularly perfidious. When someone has only half a page and a pencil to say something, they will naturally take drastic measures to make themselves heard. Such measures usually include exaggeration and distortion – and such an object, if considered literally, can give rise to disastrous interpretations. Moreover, as is typical of cartoons, cartoonists do not respect the old saying that "you don't mess with serious things". On the contrary, their eyes seem to focus almost only on serious things. To leaf through this edition of the cartoons of the year is, as always, to revisit the main political and social issues of the country and the world: the government and the opposition, major public works, climate change, the State budget, Tancos, justice, high finance, the Middle East, religion, the new "muscular democracies", Brexit. And, as has unfortunately become a habit, it is also to review some cartoons that have themselves turned into events – sometimes even more controversial than the issues they address (which is incredible).

Some people are seriously offended by a drawing, either because it touches on a subject that is sacred to them, or just because they don't understand certain obvious aspects of how humorous language works. And the problem is that, in principle, there is no point in drawing them a picture.

He has graduated in Painting from *Escola Artística António Arroio* (António Arroio School of Arts) in Lisbon, having published his first cartoons in the daily newspaper *República* in March 1974 and he is a permanent collaborator of the weekly *Expresso* since the end of that year.

ANDRÉ **CARRILHO**

Born in Amadora in 1974, he has worked as an illustrator, graphic designer, animator and caricaturist since 1992, collaborating with the most important Portuguese publications. Winner of several national and international awards, he has already had his work exhibited in Portugal, Spain, Brazil, France and USA . In 2002, he was awarded the Gold Award for IllustrationPortfolio by the Society for News Design (USA), one of the most important illustration awards in the world. *The New Yorker, The New York Times,*



Word, Vanity Fair, Harper's, The Independent on Sunday, Billboard, and *Diário de Noticias* are just a few of the publications that have featured his works. He made the animated short film *Dinner in Lisbon*, with screenplay by J.P. Simões, whose production ended in 2007.

In 2004, he embarked on a new media creation partnership called *Video Jack* with musician/programmer Nuno Correia, who edited the *Heat Seeker* CD/DVD, widely distributed in the UK, France, Poland, Estonia, Finland and Germany. Most recently, the duo carried out the *AVOL* (Audio-Visual OnLine) project, at the invitation of the Direção-Geral das Artes, and *Master and Margarita*, an audio-visual adaptation of the homonymous work by Mikhail Bulgakov.

In 2008, he and João Paulo Cotrim created the animated cartoon project *Spam Cartoon*, with the collaboration of illustrators Cristina Sampaio and João Fazenda. *Spam Cartoon* airs weekly on television channels SIC, SIC Notícias and SIC Internacional. André Carrilho lives and works in Lisbon.

Born in Lisbon, she studied Painting at ESBAL. Her work has been divided between cartoons, illustration, animation and multimedia. Courrier International in Strasbourg "Plumes Libres pour La Démocratie" in 2019. He was distinguished in other international competitions, such as an Honourable Mention in the Caricature category at the World Press Cartoon in 2018 and has been awarded the 2nd place at the 57th International Cartoon Festival Knokke-Heist in Belgium in 2018. In 2017, he was considered by Cartoon Home Network International as the best European Cartoonist, received the Success Award at the 34th Aydin Dogan International Cartoon Competition in Turkey, and was awarded with 3rd place at the 19th PortoCartoon World Festival in the Caricature category (António Guterres). In 2016, he received a Mention for Excellence at the United Nations International Cartoon Competition – Ranan Lurie Political Cartoon Award. ANTÓNIO MAIA



Born in Rio Maior in 1951. He attended Sociology, Law and Art History courses. A plastic artist and journalist, his work is divided between cartooning and painting. He published his first cartoons in 1978 in the weekly *Edição Especial*. Between 1979/80, in the newspaper *Tempo*, and also in the newspaper *A Tribuna*. From 1981 to 1983, he published in the newspaper *Expresso*. Then in the *Semanário* (1983/2000), *A Capital* (1984/2000), and from 2000 to 2009, in the newspaper *24 Horas*. He also collaborated with the magazines *Fortuna* and *Villas & Golfe* and currently with *Golf Digest*. At present, he publishes cartoons in the

newspapers *Correio da Manhã, O Ribatejo* and *Jornal do Algarve.* Since 1979, he has participated in countless solo and group exhibitions, of cartoons and paintings, in Portugal and abroad. HENRIQUE **MONTEIRO**



Born in Cabreira-do-Côa, Guarda (20-03-1969) and living in Lisbon since 1979. I did graphic works for companies. I participated in cartoon initiatives with other artists. I presented works in exhibitions promoted by Humorgrafe: Latin American Meeting of Humorous Culture, Parody & Pastiche; 20 Years of Satiric Democracy – Mário Soares seen by Caricaturists; Iconographies of Contemporary Satire, President Mário Soares in Caricature in Macau; Cartoon Exhibitions in Alcalá de Henares, Spain; 3rd Ourense Caricature Biennial, Spain. I collaborated with the publisher Elo, making comic strips for CTT, Delta Cafés and Carris.

I was a permanent staff member at the weekly newspaper

Expresso from 1993 to 2002 (where I started my career as a cartoonist and illustrator). I collaborated with the newspaper *Diário de Notícias*, where, among other things, I illustrated a bi-weekly article by Estebes (Herman José) with texts by the Gato Fedorento comedy group. I collaborated with the magazines/newspapers *Valor, Exame, Semanário Económico, Jornal do Imobiliário, Prémio magazine* and *Just Leader* magazine. I won the Award for Best Illustration at the Press Cartoon Exhibitions in 1997 and 1998, received an Honourable Mention at the 11th Portuguese-Galician Exhibition held in Vila Real in 2007, and was awarded 1st place in 2009 and 3rd place in 2014 at the Penela Festival and received an Honourable Mention in 2018. I held solo cartoon and illustration exhibitions in various parts of the country. I held a solo exhibition at Metropolitano de São Paulo, Brazil, in 2007. I published cartoons and illustrations in *Jornal i, Jornal*

de Negócios, Peninsula Press, among other publications. On the Internet, I have a cartoon blog called Henricartoon, since March 2008: http://henricartoon.blogs.sapo.pt.



Since 2009, I have a partnership with SAPO, where cartoons on topics such as sports, current affairs and family are featured on the Homepage every day. In 2013, I released the *book Enorme, brutal, colossal* 2012!, published by Asa, an album with a selection of cartoons from 2013 published in SAPO and which won the prize Best Comic Album at the Amadora Cartoon Festival. At the same festival, I was awarded the Career Award. In 2018, my blog was named Blog of the Year on a Media Capital initiative. Every year, I exhibit a selection of cartoons at *Cartoon Xira*, in Vila Franca de Xira, along with other Portuguese cartoonists.

RODRIGO DE MATOS



Cartoonist of the weekly newspaper *Expresso*, in Portugal, since 2006, publishing works in the "Economics" magazine and on the online edition. Born in Silva Porto (Angola) in 1975, he lived in Brazil until he was 15 years old, graduated in Journalism in Coimbra and worked as a journalist for six years in Lisbon until he moved to Spain, where he graduated in Editorial and Press Illustration from Esdip, in Madrid. Living

in Macau since 2009, he publishes works every week in the *Ponto Final* and *Macau Daily Times* newspapers. In 2018 one of his cartoons published on the *Expresso* was among those elected by the United Nations High Commission for Human Rights to illustrate the articles of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, in commemoration of his 70 years. He was awarded the Grand Prix Press Cartoon Europe 2014 (Belgium). Since 2015, he has been participating in the *Cartoons do Ano* series, with the best Portuguese cartoonists, and in the *Cartoon Xira* event, in Vila Franca de Xira. 
CRISTIANO SALGADO
